A&BC Scottish set re-dated

An email from Tony prompted me to review the dating of the <u>A&BC Chewing Gum Scottish</u> <u>cards</u> from the mid-1960s. Tony suggested that the cards dated as 1966/67 should actually be dated 1967/68, meaning that they were probably designed in May/June 1967 and sold to the public from July or August 1967 onwards. The obvious reason is the picture of Celtic as winners of the European Cup. The Final was held on 25 May 1967, fitting in with dating of the





set to the 1967/68 season. Thanks to Tony for helping to correct this error. I updated my website in January to reflect this change.

This advertisement is from the Topps Company for their 1979/80 set of 396 footballers. The text of the ad says: Chew the Gum. Collect the Cards. Save the Wrappers. Get Free Badges. These metal Footballer badges are worth 35p. To get one, collect the wrappers from 20 packets of Footballer Gum. Then send them off with a 10p cheque or Postal Order to cover postage and packing.

The offer is open all season and there's a Footballer badge for every team in the English First Division and Scottish Premier League. So keep this advertisement, and try and collect a whole set.

The address to write off to is Bazooka Joe, Free Badge Offer, P.O. Box 83, Chelmsford CMS 1LS. (Don't forget to state your address and the team badge you want).

I've never collected badges, only football cards, so I was not aware of the existence of these Topps badges, and I wonder how common, or how rare, they are. At 10p each (for p&h) I wonder whether anyone ever collected more than one at the time. I also wonder if anyone has tried to put the full set together since 1979. 

Roy Race Football Club Badge mystery

Derek recently sent me an email which began an as-yet unsolved mystery hunt. Apparently Derek and I both own a sheet of stickers (pictured) which we have assumed belong to the 1967/68 Roy Race Football Club Badges album. However, Derek pointed out that the sheet sticker numbers do not match the album numbers (and therefore do not match the checklists published on my website). Further investigation has revealed other anomalies.



I checked the sheet numbers with the album. For example, Arbroath is

number 4 in the book/album, has number 4 printed on the sticker, but our sheet has this sticker with number 5, so it is not just an anomaly between stickers and album. There are actually stickers which exactly match the album (I own a complete copy of the album where the stickers line up with placement and team names in the album).

So what is going on here? Do Derek and I own a sheet from a different set altogether? Was this Roy Race album issued more than once? Were there different versions? Did Fleetway issue the same type of album and stickers with any of their other comics? Pictured at left is a sheet listed once on ebay which matches the stickers in the album, but the stickers are in the same placement and order as the sheet that Derek and I own, so whoever produced one also produced the other.

It appears that the sheet may pre-date the album. The brilliant website <u>Historical Football Kits</u> offers some clues. If you look at Northampton Town you will see that the town crest (the version on the sheet) was used from 1963 to 1967, but the version in the Roy Race album appears to be the more recent and current crest, suggesting that the album stickers are later than the sheet.

If you could shed any light on this mystery it would be appreciated. Also, if you have sheets of the other stickers it would be good to know which teams and badges are included.

And the answer to the mystery is....

Thanks to Alan and Bob. Apparently, 7 years before this set was issued as the Roy Race set, it was issued by the Tiger comic. So, the sheet is from the original 1960 issue, and the other stickers are from the album issue of 1967. As you can see from the image kindly sent by Bob, the album and first 25 stickers were given away as a free gift in the September 24, 1960 issue of the Tiger.
